INTRODUCTION

This booklet was produced by the Post-16 Data Team at Portsmouth City Council for the use of Secondary Schools across Portsmouth. It provides Key Data about Young People who completed Year 11 on 31st August 2016.

The data in this booklet is based on a cohort of young people who were recorded as being academically aged year 11 and attending a Portsmouth School on 31st May 2016. The year 12 destination data relating to this cohort is a snapshot of their status on 1st November 2016. All data in this booklet has been taken from the Core+ IYSS system which is used by the Education Department at Portsmouth City Council and is generated using a program which identifies the destinations (on 1st November 2016) of those who left year 11 in 2015/16.

The topics covered in this report are based on the performance measures used by the Department for Education (DfE) and the figures given are at Local Authority (LA) level.

This booklet acts as a resource for establishments (schools) to monitor their current performance, to plan future strategies and to spot potential issues before they arise.

Due to Raising the Participation Age (RPA) legislation, as of September 2014, young people are now under a duty to participate in education or training until the end of the academic year in which they turn 18 (academic year 13). KEY ANALYSIS POINTS - PORTSMOUTH LA

2016 has been the best year since 2010 for the percentage of year 11 leavers whose destination meets the RPA with 95.4%. The RPA Not Met percentage for 2016 is 4.1% which is lower than in 2015.

87.9% of year 11 leavers went on to an FE College or a Sixth Form Establishment, with FE College being a slightly more popular destination than a Sixth Form Establishment.

37.9% of year 11 leavers who now have a destination of FE College or a Sixth Form Establishment are studying A Levels, this is lower than in 2015 (50%) however, this may be due to more accurate recording of qualifications in Core+ in 2016. 59.7% of leavers whose current education course is known are studying at level 3 (including A Levels). 36.8% are studying at level 2 or below.

The percentage of RPA Met is slightly higher for males than females. 95.4% of males are in a participating destination as opposed to 95.3% of females.

89.3% of females went onto an FE College or Sixth Form Establishment in comparison to 86.7% of males. A higher percentage of both males and females went to a FE College rather than a Sixth Form Establishment.

1% more year 11 leavers without LDD in Year 11 went on to a participating destination than those with LDD. The most popular destination for young people with LDD was an FE College with 63.3% attending one.

The percentage of year 11 leavers in a destination that meets the RPA is 0.7% higher for those who are not considered disadvantaged than those who are. The RPA Met percentage for those who are disadvantaged is 94.9% whereas for those who are not disadvantaged the percentage is 95.6%. The most popular destination for young people who are disadvantaged was an FE College with 53.7% attending. The gap in RPA between those who are disadvantaged and are not disadvantaged decreased in 2016 by 3.1%.

Of the year 11 leavers whose ethnicity is BME, 96.9% are now in a destination which meets the RPA, which is higher than the overall LA percentage and 1.9% higher than the percentage of White British leavers that went to a participating destination.

The most popular destination for BME Year 11 Leavers was a Sixth Form Establishment with 55.6%, whereas the most popular destination for White British was FE College.

94.6% of year 11 leavers had a positive September Guarantee Offer and went on to a destination that meets the RPA.

87.1% of year 11 leavers met their Intended Destination with their current destination. Of those with a positive Intended Destination 90.4% went onto a positive destination in year 12.

Of the Year 11 Leavers who went on to an FE College or a Sixth Form Establishment the most popular FE Establishment was Portsmouth College with 35.7% of young people attending there.

Raising the Participation Age (RPA) Summary

Table 1 shows the count and percentage of Year 11 leavers who were in a participating destination for the last 6 years. The 'Other' category includes young people whose destination is unknown and who have the RPA status 'Working towards participation' or 'Temporary Break'.



Graph 1 shows the percentage of year 11 leavers in Portsmouth whose destination met the RPA over the last 6 years. It should be noted that until 2013 it was not a statutory requirement for 17 year olds to be in a participating destination.

Portsmouth Year 11 Leavers Destinations (2011-2016)

Table 2a shows the number of year 11 leavers who were in each destination category for the last 6 years in Portsmouth. Table 2b shows the same data as percentages. Please see Appendix for destination category descriptions.

From 2015 the destination categories 'Sixth Form' and 'FT Training inc App' were split to better represent the types of destinations leavers are going into. 'Sixth Form' has been separated into 'School Sixth Form' and 'Sixth Form College'. 'FT Training inc App' has been separated into 'FT Training' and 'Apprenticeship'. A total for these categories has been kept in order to compare them to the previous 5 years.

Prior to 2015 many Sixth Form College destinations were recorded as FE College instead of Sixth Form, therefore it appears that there is a decrease in the percentage of leavers attending an FE College and an increase in Sixth Form being attended, however, this may be as a result of more accurate recording. In 2015 there was also a large increase in the number of young people whose destination was an Apprenticeship, this may also be affected by more accurate recording, as many Apprenticesips given through Colleges were previously recorded as FE College or Sixth Form instead of Apprenticeship.


Portsmouth Year 11 Leavers Destinations (2011-2016) Graph

Graph 2 shows that over the last 6 years the majority of Year 11 leavers have gone on to either an FE College or Sixth Form.

In 2016, 88.2% of Year 11 Leavers in Portsmouth went onto either an FE College or Sixth Form, this is an increase from 2015 when 87.7% went onto those destinations.

Year 11 Leavers Post 16 Qualification Types being Studied


Table 3 shows the types of qualifications currently being studied by year 11 leavers at an FE College, Sixth Form College or School Sixth Form only.

'Other Education Course' includes those who are studying a course that was not specified by an FE Establishment or a qualification that does not fit into any other category.

Graph 3 shows that 37.9% of Year 11 leavers currently at an FE College, School Sixth Form or Sixth Form College are studying A Levels. Just under 60% of Year 11 Leavers at an FE College, School Sixth Form or Sixth Form College are now studying a Level 3 Qualification.

Qualifications being studied by Year 11 Leavers at an FE Establishment





Table 4 shows that 0.1% more males are in a destination the mets than RPA than females. For both males and females the most popular destination is a Further Education College.

Table 5 shows the destinations of year 11 leavers by LDD Status. In this data LDD means they had a Statement of Special Education Need or an EHCP in Year 11.



From Table 5 we can see that a higher percentage of Year 11 leavers without LDD are in a destination that meets the RPA than those with LDD. Also a higher percentage of those with LDD attend an FE College rather than a Sixth Form Establishment.

Year 11 Leavers Destinations by LDD Status




Portsmouth Year 11 Leavers Destinations by Disadvantaged Status

Table 6 shows the destinations of year 11 leavers by Disadvantaged Status. A disadvantaged pupil is, as defined by the DfE, any pupil who has been eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years and any pupil who has ever been looked after by the local authority.

Table 6 shows that more Year 11 leavers who are not disadvantaged went on to a destination that meets the RPA than those who are disadvantaged. Graph 6 shows that an FE College is a more popular choice than a Sixth Form Establishment for those who are disadvantaged.




Portsmouth Year 11 Leavers Destinations by Ethnicity

From Table 7 we can see that a higher percentage of BME Year 11 Leavers have a destination that meets the RPA than White British Year 11 Leavers. Graph 7 shows us that BME young people are more likely to go to a Sixth Form Establishment than an FE College. Of those who went to either an FE College or Sixth Form, 60.4% of BME young people are attending a Sixth Form, compared to 43.8% of White British young people.



September Guarantee and RPA Met

Table 8a compares year 11 leavers September Guarantee Offer to whether their year 12 actual destination meets the RPA. Table 8b shows the same data as percentages.

The 'Other' RPA category includes young people whose destination is unknown, who have moved out of the area, or who have the RPA status 'Working towards participation' or 'Temporary Break'.

The September Guarantee Status 'No Information' refers to young people we were unable to contact in order to find out if they had a September offer.



If their ID was 'Other' we have been unable to determine if their ID has been met.

FE Establishments attended by Year 11 Leavers



LDD	Learning Difficulties and Disability. In this data only those young people who had an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) or Statement in year 11.								
NEET	Not in Education, Employment or Training.								
NEET - Available	Those who are NEET are currently able to work.								
NEET - Not Available	Those who are NEET but not currently able to work due to illness, pregnancy, being a teenage parent or young carer.								
RPA	Raising the Participation Age. Young people now have to stay in education or training until their 18th Birthday.								
September Guarantee	This is the process of ensuring that Year 11's who are leaving Compulsory school have had an offer of education or training in September that meets the RPA.								
Unknown	Young people whose destination cannot be confirmed.
