

# **Year 11 Activity Survey**

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## **INTRODUCTION**

This booklet was produced by the Post-16 Data Team at Portsmouth City Council for the use of Secondary Schools across Portsmouth. It provides key data about Young People who completed Year 11 on 31st August 2020.

The data in this booklet is based on a cohort of young people who were recorded as being academically aged year 11 and attending a Portsmouth School on 31st May 2020. The year 12 destination data relating to this cohort is a snapshot of their status on 1st November 2020. All data in this booklet has been taken from the Core+ IYSS system which is used by the Education Department at Portsmouth City Council and is generated using a program which identifies the destinations (on 1st November 2020) of those who left year 11 in 2019/20.

Please note that this data is not the same data used in Destination Measures. Destination measures are the data that the Department for Education publishes in performance tables as an accountability tool. This information is taken from administrative datasets (for example, on school, college and university enrolments, and employment and benefits information) which the Department holds and links together as part of the national pupil database (NPD) and Longitudinal Educational Outcomes (LEO) datasets. As a result, there are often differences between what is recorded locally in schools and colleges and what actually occurs and is recorded in DfE administrative data.

The topics covered in this report are based on the performance measures used by the Department for Education (DfE) and the figures given are at Local Authority (LA) level and establishment level.

This booklet acts as a resource for establishments (schools) to monitor their current performance, to plan future strategies and to spot potential issues before they arise.

Under the Raising the Participation Age (RPA) legislation, as of September 2016, young people are under a duty to participate in education or training until the end of the academic year in which they turn 18 (academic year 13).

## **KEY ANALYSIS POINTS - PORTSMOUTH LA**

95.2% of year 11 leavers were in a participating destination in 2020, which is an increase of 0.8 percentage points compared to 2019 (94.5%).

91.5% of year 11 leavers went on to an FE College or a Sixth Form Establishment in 2020, which is an increase of 1.6 percentage points compared to 2019 destination results (89.9%).

Of those leavers that went on to an FE College or Sixth Form Establishment in 2020, 25.1% are studying A Levels, which is lower than the previous year (30.7%). 59.7% are studying at level 3 (including A Levels), and 40.3% are studying at level 2 or below.

The percentage of RPA Met is higher for females than for males. 96.4% of females went on to a participating destination as opposed to 94.1% of males. 93.9% of females went to an FE College or Sixth Form Establishment in comparison to 89.2% of males.

Females were less likely to go on to an apprenticeship than males with 2.1% of female year 11 leavers going on to an apprenticeship compared to 3.7% of males.

The percentage of RPA Met is lower for year 11 leavers with SEND than those without. 88.6% of year 11 leavers with SEND went on to a participating destination compared to 96.7% of those without SEND. 84.7% of year 11 leavers with SEND went to an FE College or Sixth Form Establishment in comparison to 92.9% of those without SEND.

The percentage of RPA Met is lower for those who are disadvantaged than those who are not. 92.5% of disadvantaged pupils went on to a participating destination compared to 96.6% of those not disadvantaged. 89.1% of year 11 leavers who are disadvantaged went to an FE College or Sixth Form Establishment in comparison to 92.7% of those not disadvantaged.

Disadvantaged pupils were less likely to go on to an apprenticeship than not disadvantaged pupils, with 1.8% of disadvantaged year 11 leavers going on to an apprenticeship compared to 3.5% of not disadvantaged pupils.

The percentage of RPA Met is lower for those who are White British year 11 leavers than those from another Ethnic group. 94.6% of White British year 11 leavers went on to a participating destination compared to 96.8% of those from another Ethnic group. 96.2% of young people from another Ethnic group went to an FE College or Sixth Form Establishment in comparison to 90.4% of White British pupils.

Young people from another Ethnic group were less likely to go on to an apprenticeship than their White British counterparts, with 0.3% of year 11 leavers from another Ethnic group going on to an apprenticeship compared to 3.1% of White British pupils.

94.2% of year 11 leavers who had a September Guarantee Offer, went on to a destination that meets the RPA.

Of the Year 11 Leavers who went on to an FE College or a Sixth Form Establishment, the most popular was Portsmouth College with 36.2% of young people attending there.

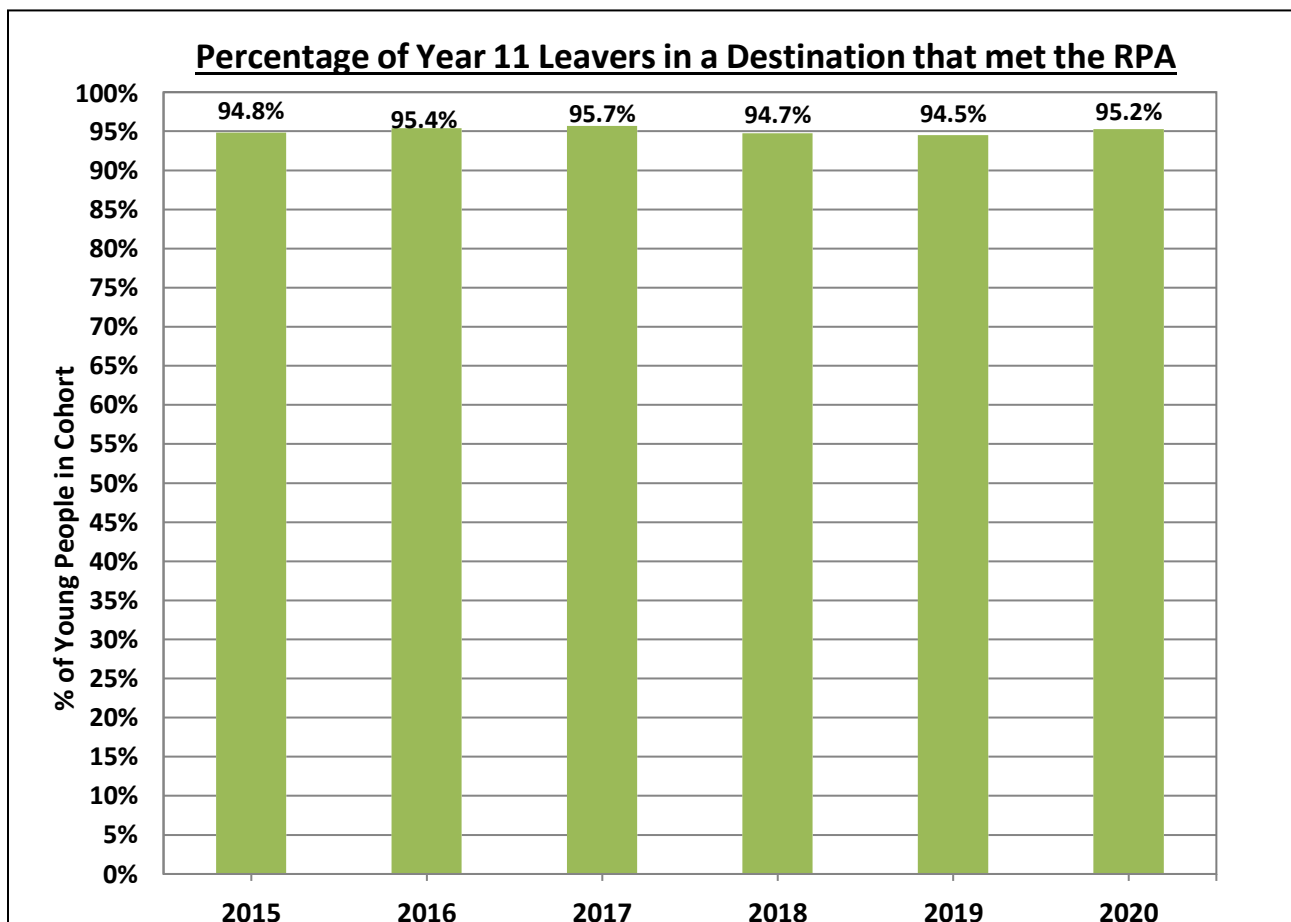

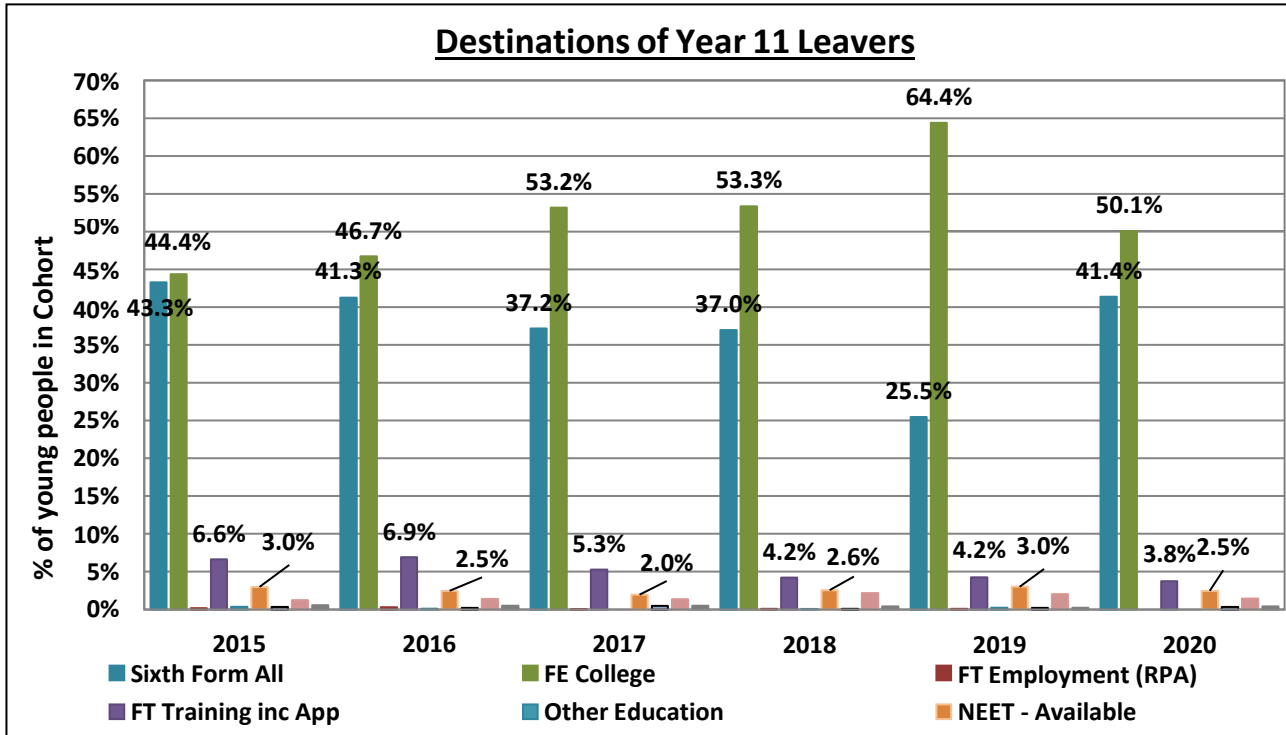

## Portsmouth Year 11 Leavers Destinations (2015-2020) Graph

In 2020, 91.5% of Year 11 Leavers in Portsmouth went on to either an FE College or Sixth Form, this is a 1.6 percentage point increase from 2019 when 89.9% went on to those destinations.

Graph 2 shows that over the last 6 years the majority of Year 11 leavers have gone on to either an FE College or Sixth Form.

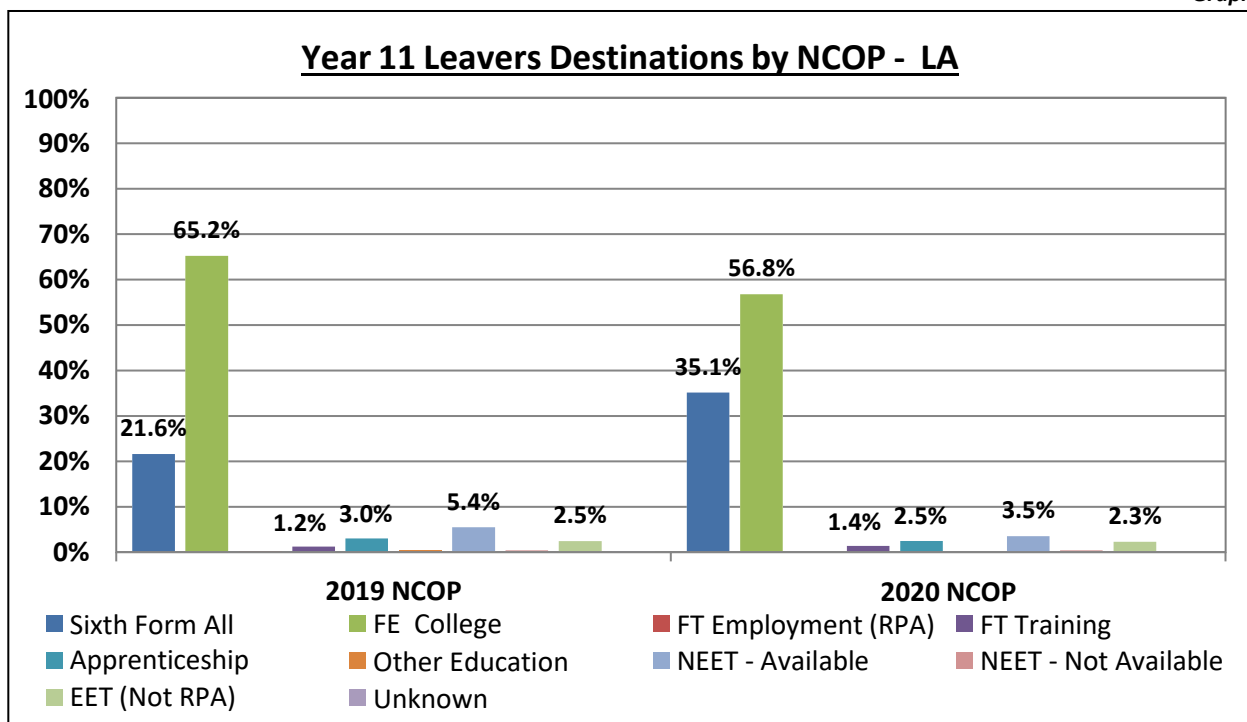

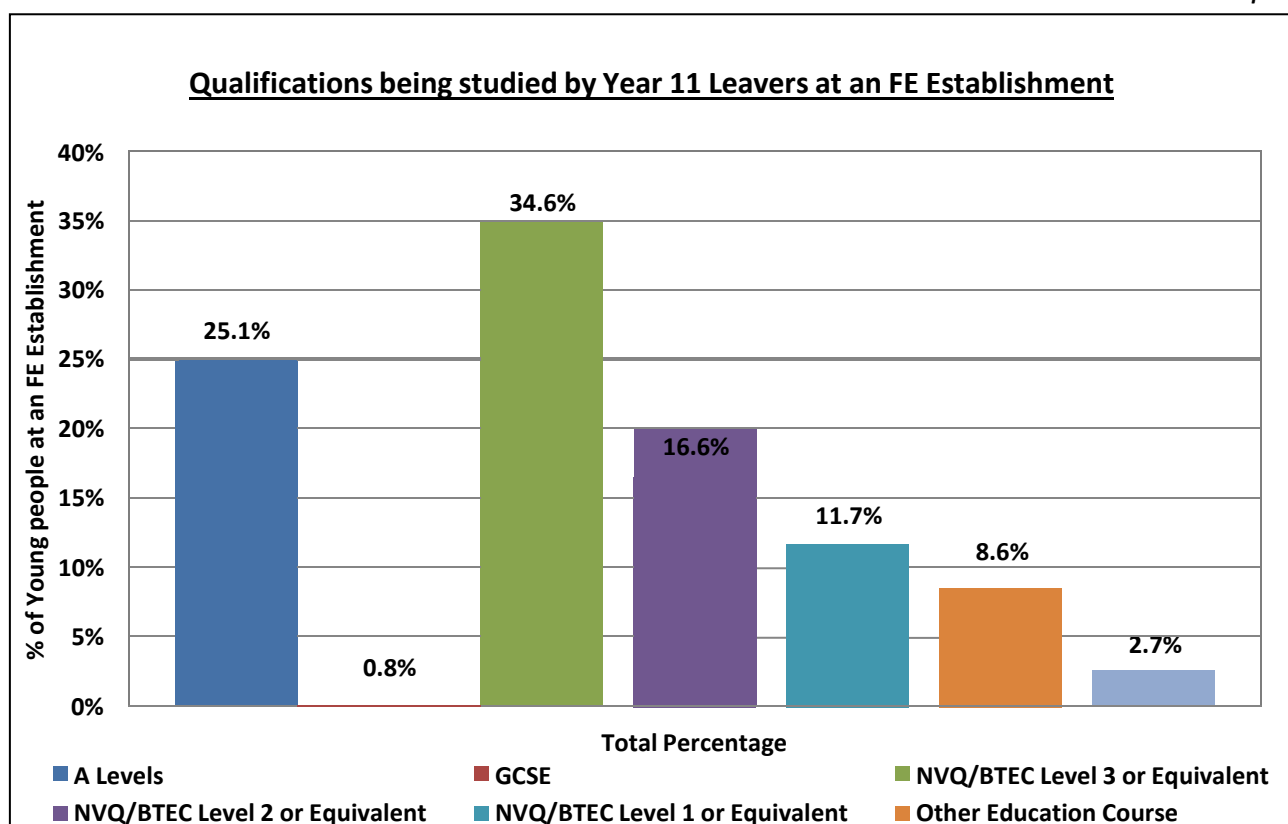

Graph 3 shows that 25.1% of Year 11 leavers currently at an FE College, School Sixth Form or Sixth Form College are studying A Levels. 59.7% of Year 11 Leavers at an FE College, School Sixth Form or Sixth Form College are now studying a Level 3 Qualification including A Levels.

Table 4 shows the types of qualifications currently being studied by year 11 leavers at an FE College, Sixth Form College or School Sixth Form only, broken down by gender.

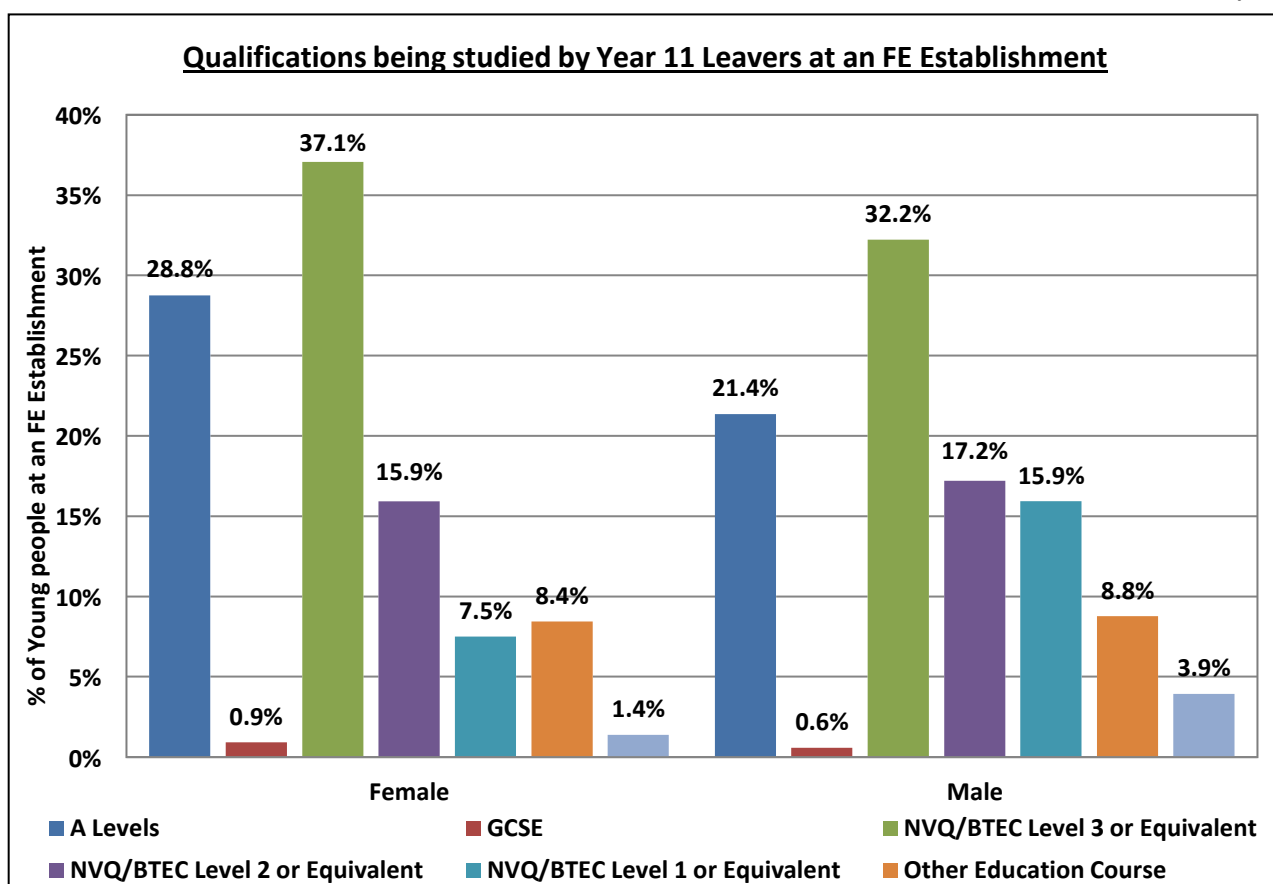

Graph 4 shows that 28.8% of female and 21.4% of male Year 11 leavers currently at an FE College, School Sixth Form or Sixth Form College are studying A Levels. 65.8% of female and 53.6% of male Year 11 Leavers at an FE College, School Sixth Form or Sixth Form College are now studying a Level 3 Qualification including A Levels.

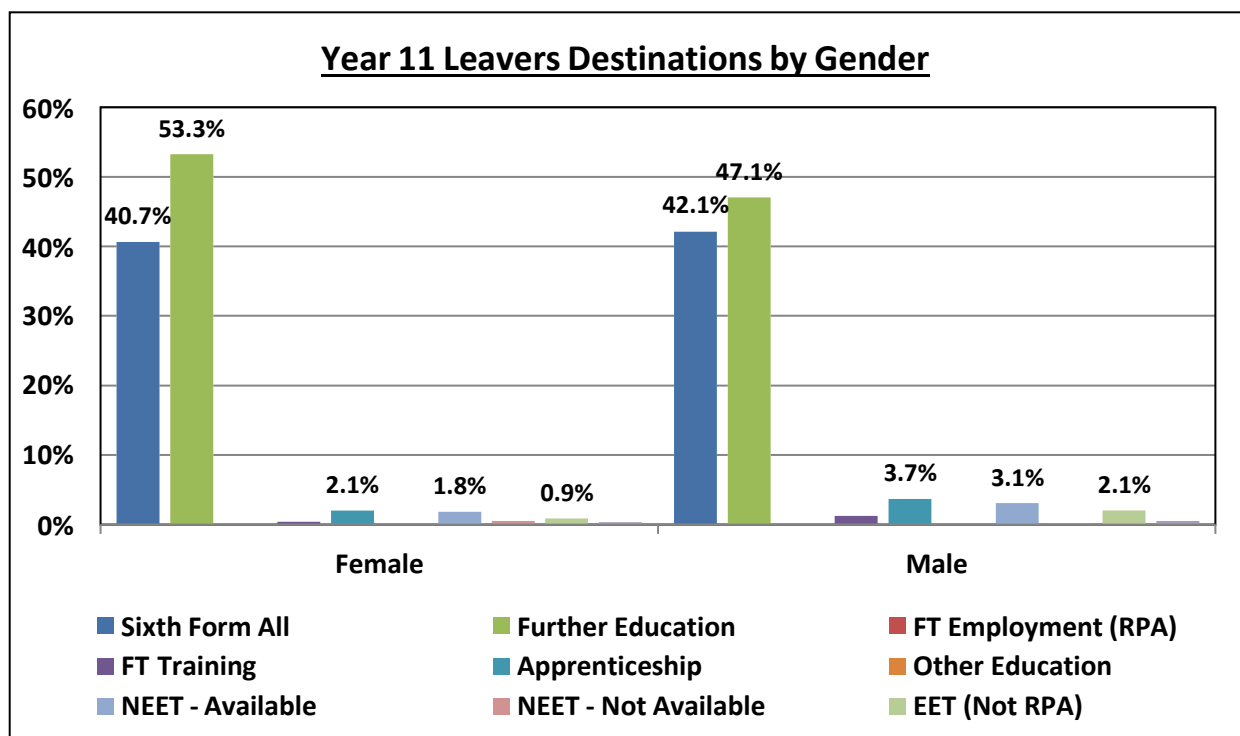
Table 5 shows that 2.3 percentage points more females are in a destination that meets the RPA than males. For both males and females the most popular destination is an FE college.

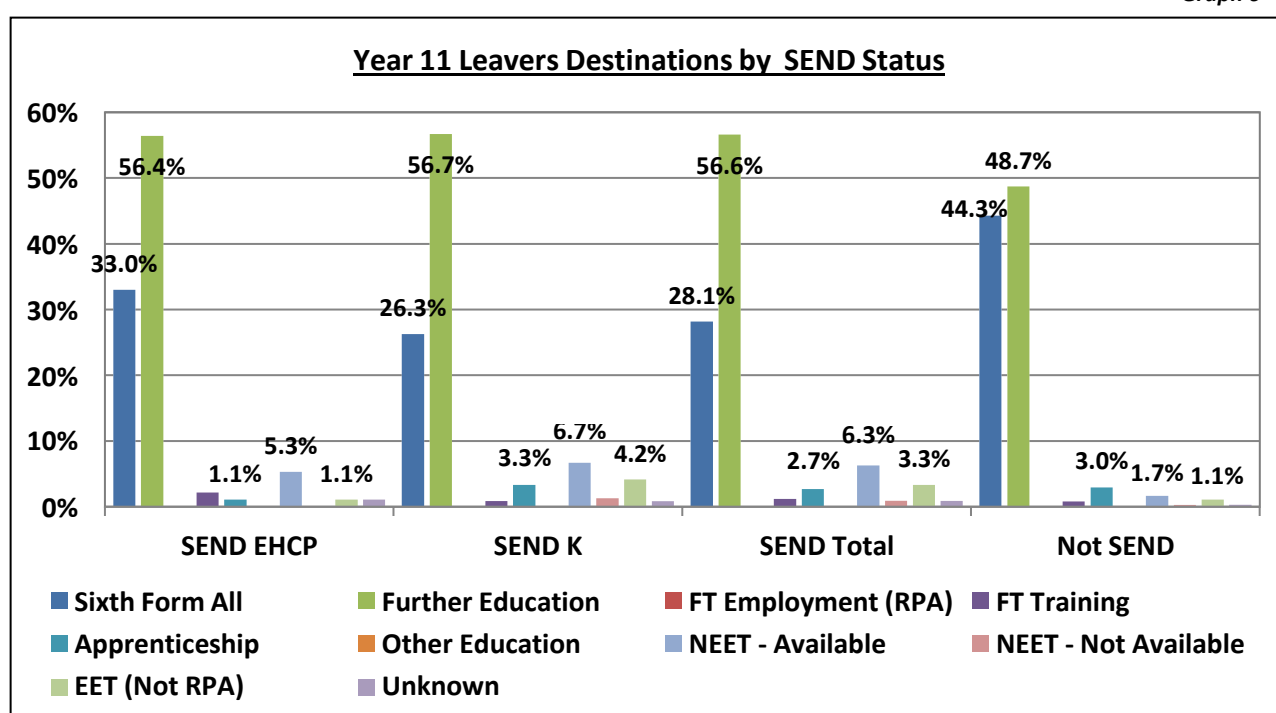

From Table 6 we can see that a higher percentage of Year 11 leavers without SEND are in a destination that meets the RPA than those with SEND. Also a higher percentage of those with SEND attend an FE College rather than a Sixth Form Establishment.

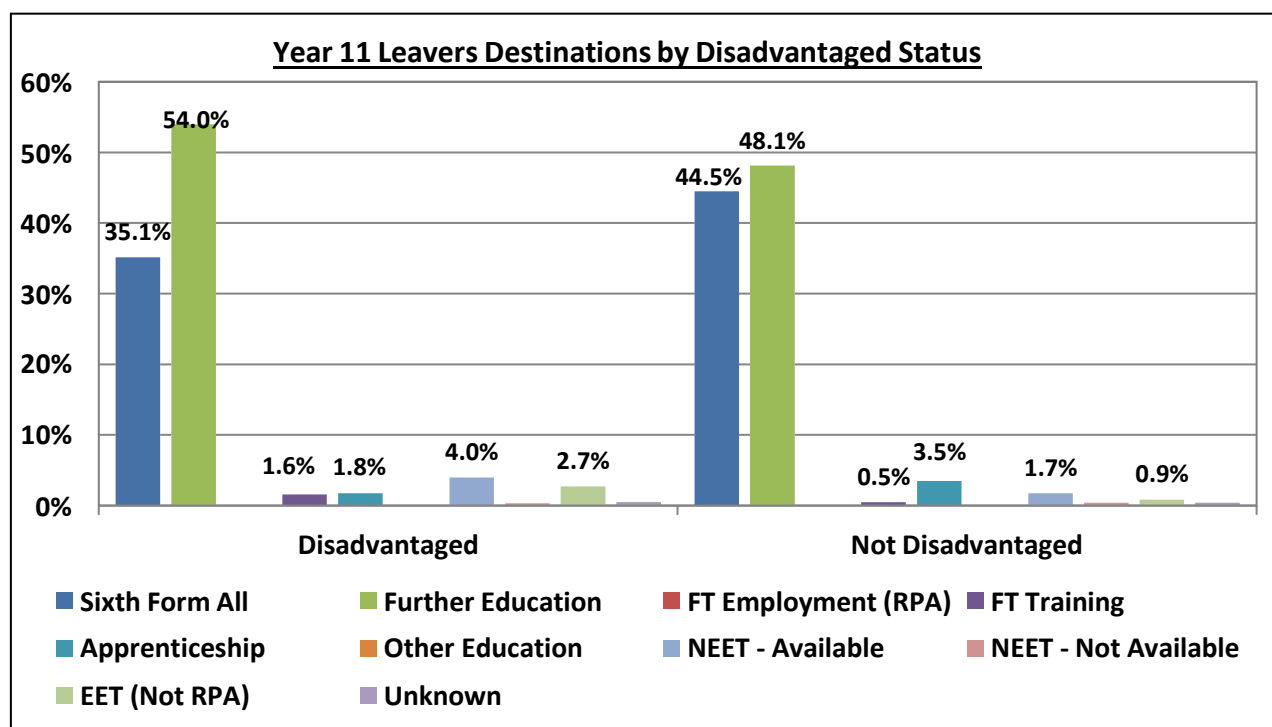

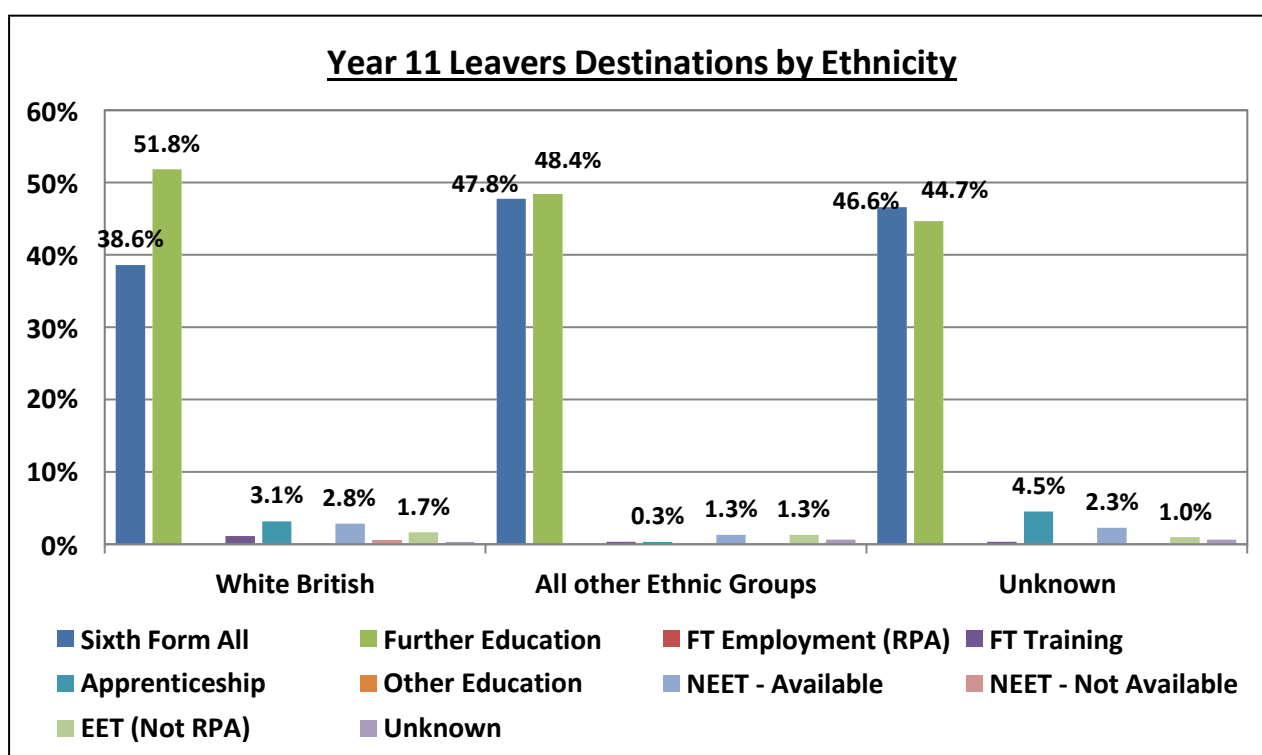

From Table 8 we can see that a higher percentage of Year 11 Leavers from another Ethnic group have a destination that meets the RPA than White British Year 11 Leavers. Graph 8 shows us that young people from another Ethnic group are more likely to go to a Sixth Form Establishment than their White British counterparts. 47.8% of young people from another Ethnic group are attending a Sixth Form, compared to 38.6% of White British young people.

## September Guarantee and RPA Met

The September Guarantee Status 'No Information' refers to young people we were unable to contact in order to find out if they had a September offer.

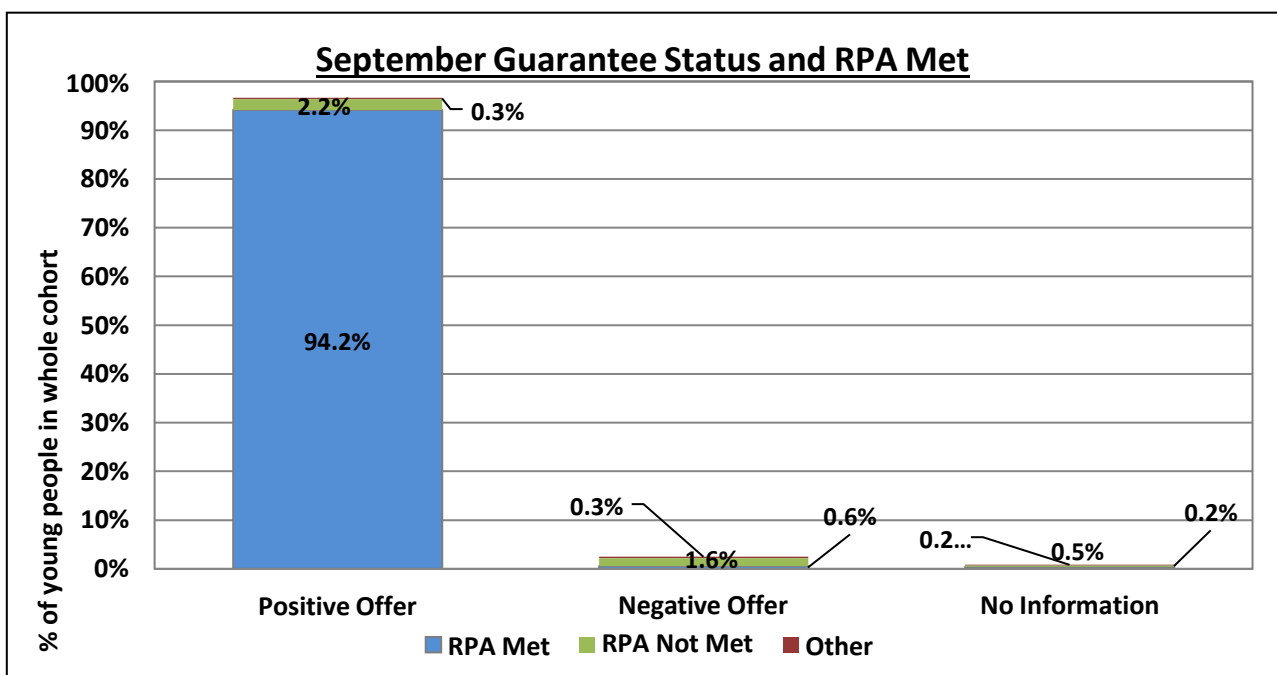

## FE Establishments attended by Year 11 Leavers

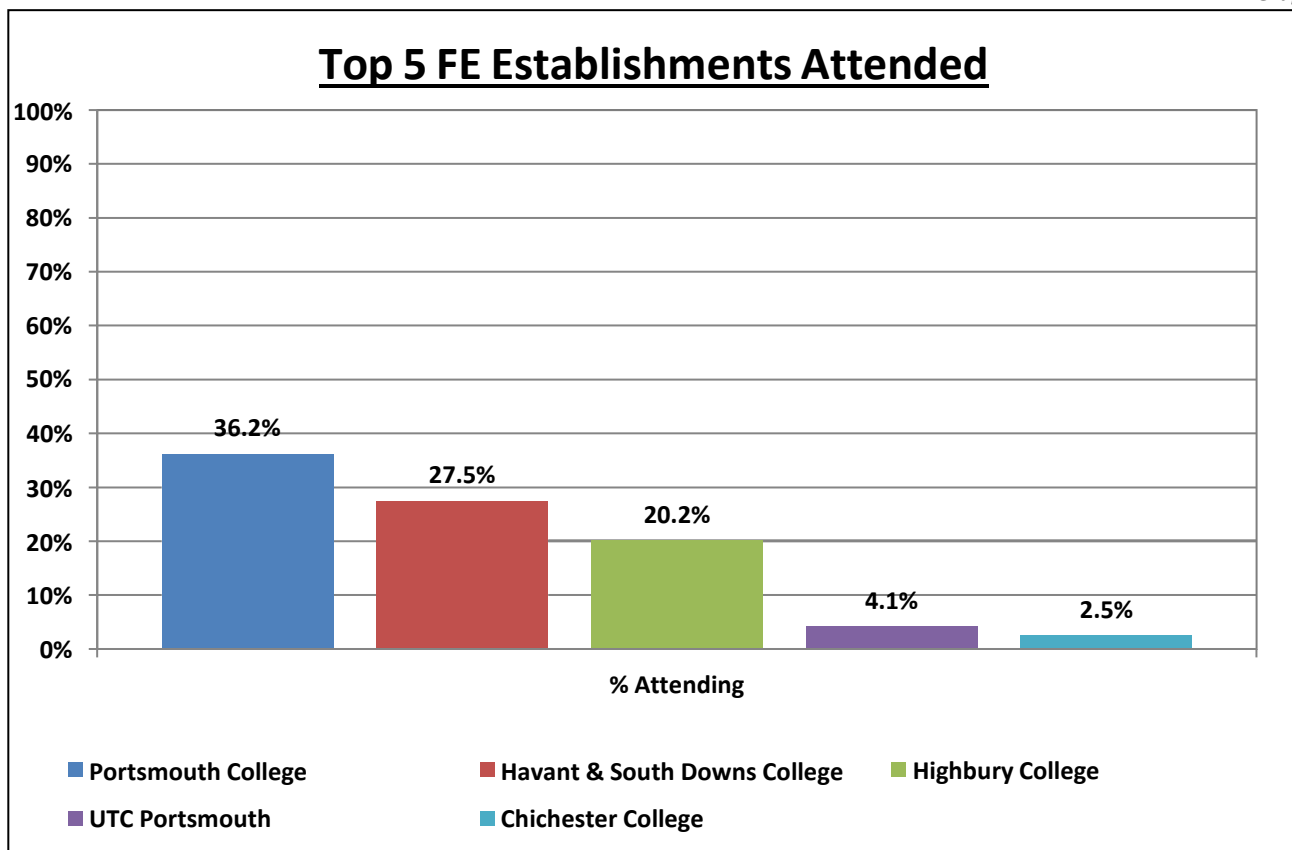

## GLOSSARY

Term	Description
All other Ethnic Groups	Any young person who isn't recorded as White British or as Unknown Ethnicity.
Disadvantaged	Young people who were eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years and any young person that was looked after by the authority at any point.
Destination	The Activity of the young person.
EET	In Education, Employment or Training.
SEND	Special educational needs and disability. In this data only those young people who had an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) or on SEN Support (K) plan, while in Year 11.
SEND Support (K)	Special educational provision in schools. SEN support is a staged approach to identifying needs, and providing support to children and young people
NCOP	National Collaborative Outreach Programme. An NCOP student is a student in Year 9 - 14 who lives in an area (identified by postcodes) where Higher Education participation is lower than might be expected (given the GCSE results of the young people who live there).
NEET	Not in Education, Employment or Training.
NEET - Available	Those who are NEET are currently able to work.
NEET - Not Available	Those who are NEET but not currently able to work due to illness, pregnancy, being a teenage parent or young carer.
RPA	Raising the Participation Age. Young people now have to stay in education or training until their 18th Birthday.
September Guarantee	This is the process of ensuring that Year 11's who are leaving Compulsory school have had an offer of education or training in September that meets the RPA.
Unknown	Young people whose destination cannot be confirmed.
