In addition to being a staunch supporter of, and frequent speaker at our hub meetings, Marie Allen works as an adviser for the Ethnic Minority Achievement Service (EMAS) in Portsmouth. Primary Languages has been a statutory part of the KS2 curriculum for almost ten years and Portsmouth, as a <u>City</u>, welcomes increasing numbers of citizens from increasingly diverse ethnicities and backgrounds. Many of our new citizens may need support with English but they may also already be bilingual or multilingual. Doesn't it make sense to break down the silos and find ways of working together?

In this session Marie will tap into her different teaching experiences to look at approaches and strategies used by MFL and EAL teachers within schools, shining a light on the similarities between the two. 12 WAYS TO SUPPORT WORKING MEMORY

FOR EFFECTIVE TEACHING FOR LEARNING

1: SELF-TESTING



Encouraging students to test themselves on material they have learned.

2: SPACED REPETITION



Distributing learning over time rather than massing it all at once.

3: SELECTIVE REPETITION



Repeating important information while ignoring less important information.

4: STRUCTURED VISUALISATION



Creating mental images or visual associations that help to encode and remember information.

5: PROCESSING TIME



Allowing students sufficient time to process information can help support their working memory.

6: GLEAR INSTRUCTIONS



Give clear and concise instructions for tasks or assignments and model accordingly.

7: REDUCE DISTRACTIONS



Minimising distractions in the learning environment, such as noise or cluttered visual displays.

8: ACTIVATE PRIOR KNOWLEDGE



Connecting new information to what students already know.

9: PROVIDE ACCOMMODATIONS



Adjusting the learning environment or materials to suit students' needs based on their profiles

10: ACTIVE LEARNING



Active learning involves engaging students in activities that require them to be mentally active, rather than passively receiving information.

11: CHUNKING INFORMATION



Breaking down complex information into smaller, more manageable pieces.

12: PROVIDE FEEDBACK



Providing feedback on students' performance to help them improve their understanding and memory of the material.
